

NOTICE OF PROPOSED PLAN MODIFICATIONS AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

Northern Nevada Workforce Area Local Plan Summary 1 July 2012 through 30 June 2015

Nevadaworks is the administrative entity for the Workforce Investment Act Title I Adult, Youth and Dislocated Worker programs in Northern Nevada. The designated Local Workforce Investment Board for Northern Nevada is comprised of the Nevadaworks Council and the Nevadaworks Local Elected Officials. The Northern Nevada Workforce Investment Area is comprised of the following thirteen counties: Carson City, Churchill, Douglas, Elko, Eureka, Humboldt, Lander, Lyon, Mineral, Pershing, Storey, Washoe, and White Pine.

The One-Stop in northern Nevada for Workforce Investment Act programs is the Nevada JobConnect office in Reno. Nevadaworks has chosen the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation (DETR) as operator to oversee the daily operations and services of the One-Stop at the Reno JobConnect center.

Plan modifications to the Northern Nevada Local Plan, available on the Nevadaworks website at: www.nevadaworks.com/local-plan/, are requested as follows:

1. Remove the chart at Section E.5, Performance Management, page 21, to replace with language identifying the performance measures and describing LWIB procedures to manage goal attainment. The State of Nevada, Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation and U.S. Department of Labor negotiate and revise the goals each year. The chart with performance goals for the most recent program year is listed in the Northern Nevada Workforce Area Annual Report and posted on the Nevadaworks website.
2. Add the following language regarding transfer of funds between programs to Section G.2, Financial, page 35, in compliance with Section 3.8 of the State Compliance Policies.
 - The Board will exercise transfer authority between Adult and Dislocated Worker program funding if applicable during the program year.
